

Dear LNESC students,

Many of you are currently enrolled in an undergraduate or associate degree program, are in the process of applying, or are planning ahead for next steps after high school graduation. Pursing higher education is an exciting milestone in everyone's life but can come with frustration and setbacks. It's important to be aware of opportunities that may lessen the financial burdens and barriers that limit your access to achieving your dreams of higher education.

LNESC hopes to simplify the scholarship research process by providing students with information on available scholarships that you otherwise may not be aware of. Many of the scholarships we're providing do not inquire about immigration status or require a valid social security number. The overview of each scholarship below includes website links, deadlines, and important information. The list is ordered alphabetically by scholarship name. We advise you to visit the organization and provider websites for more complete details and possible changes in deadline or requirements as each opportunity is subject to changes.

At the end of this document are links to external databases through which you can find additional scholarships. We hope that you will take advantage of this resource and apply to scholarships that are helpful to you!

- Students who will be entering their freshman year of college in the fall of 2024 are eligible to apply.
- Students must plan to pursue careers in the atmospheric or related oceanic and hydrologic sciences, marine biology is not eligible.
- Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

• Students eligible to apply for the AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities may also apply to the AMS Freshman Scholarship Program but can only accept one scholarship if selected for both.

AFSCME Union Scholars Program Summer Internship Becas Scholarship Program**

- Have a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA.
- Be a college student of a historically marginalized community and demonstrate an interest in working for Social and economic justice through the labor union movement.
- Have a valid driver's license.
- Provide a faculty recommendation.

TRSRM Foundation Scholarship

- Students must attend a four-year accredited college or university within the United States
- Financial need is a factor that we consider in awarding scholarships.
- must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or have a valid Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from the Department of Homeland Security showing any one of the following designations: Refugee, Asylum Granted, Indefinite Parole, Humanitarian Parole, or Cuban-Haitian Entrant in order to apply.
- Only applicants from the NY, NJ, Connecticut area are eligible
- Three letters of recommendation. Two of these should be written by your high school counselor, teacher, or principal. The third letter may be submitted by someone who knows you well and can attest to your character, leadership ability, commitment to community service, and/or academic achievement.
