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Que Pasa: Updates and Happenings at LNESC

Ford Fund Scholarship Awards \$220,000 in Financial Support

In 2023, LNESC and Ford Fund collaborated to create a new scholarship fund for two- and four-year college students pursuing STEM-related career areas that support the Electric Vehicles and Advanced ManufacturingIndustries.

The fund specifically provides support for tools, resources, technology, and/or experiences that are critical for students to thrive in their studies, helping to develop critical Future of Work skills that will help them succeed after graduation.

The 2023 Ford Fund Scholarship program awarded 46 students with scholarships ranging from \$3,000 to \$5,000, totaling \$220,000 in awards.

Ford Auto Tech Scholarship



LNESC's long-standing partner, the Ford Fund, in collaboration with Ford Dealers across ten regions, will invest \$2,000,000 in scholarships to address the needs for aspiring future auto technicians in the industry.

The program will award \$5,000 scholarships to eligible students pursing a degree in auto and auto/diesel technology at select schools in the greater **Atlanta**, **Chicago**, **Cincinnati**, **Dallas**, **Detroit**, **Kansas**, **Memphis**, **Miami**, **Phoenix**, **and Seattle** areas. This need-based scholarship will be applied to a student's tuition and may be used for education-related costs, such as tuition, tools, transportation, and room and board.

FAFSA Week of Action









LNESC participated in the FAFSA Week of Action, which took place from April 15-19, 2024. It


was a collaboration with the White House and the Department of Education to promote the newly launched Better FAFSA.

The redesigned FAFSA now requires less than 15 minutes to complete, thanks to a more streamlined, user-friendly interface. Additionally, the changes to the eligibility criteria mean that an additional 665,000 students will now qualify for Federal Pell Grants and 1.7 million more will receive the maximum Pell Grant amount. This makes college more accessible than ever!
