



Dear LNEESC students,

Many of you are currently enrolled in an undergraduate or associate degree program, are in the process of applying, or are planning ahead for next steps after high school graduation. It's important to be aware of opportunities that may lessen the financial burdens and barriers that limit your access to achieving your dreams of higher education.

LNEESC hopes to simplify the scholarship research process by providing students with information on available scholarships that you otherwise may not be aware of. Many of the scholarships we're providing do not inquire about immigration status or require a valid social security number. The overview of each scholarship below includes website links, deadlines, and important information. The list is ordered alphabetically by scholarship name. We advise you to visit the organization and provider websites for more complete details and possible changes in deadline or requirements as each opportunity is subject to changes.

At the end of this document are links to external databases through which you can find additional scholarships. We hope that you will take advantage of this resource and apply to scholarships that are helpful to you!

CUNY Becas Scholarship Program

Award: \$7,000

Deadline: February 28, 2022

Requirements:

- Have graduated or will graduate from high school or have earned or will earn a high school equivalency diploma
- Intend to enroll full time in an associate or baccalaureate program at a CUNY Campus in Fall 2021 AND Spring 2022
- OR If a Graduate Student, must intend to enroll full time in a master's degree program either Fall 2021 OR Spring 2022
- Must demonstrate significant financial need

- Willingness to be a lifelong learner
- Openness to share experiences and accomplishments to inspire other students

The Dream.US National Scholarship

Award: \$16,500 for an associate degree and \$33,000 for a bachelor's degree, at one of the Partner Colleges

Requirements:

- Came to the United States before the age of 16;
- Have continuously resided in the United States since November 1, 2015 up to the present time and have had no lawful status;
- Are currently in high school or have graduated from a United States high school or obtained a general education development (GED) certificate from a United States Program; and
- Have not been convicted of a felony, significant misdemeanor, or three or more other misdemeanors in the categories which would have disqualified you for DACA, and do not otherwise pose a threat to national security or public safety.

DAV Jesse Brown Memorial Youth Scholarship

Award: \$20,000; \$15,000; \$10,000; \$7,500(2); and \$5,000(3)

Requirements:

- Scholarships can be awarded to any volunteer who is age 21 or younger and has volunteered for a minimum of 100 hours in service to veterans.
- Volunteer hours can be accumulated at a VA medical center, under DAV's Volunteer for Veterans Program and/or the Local Veterans Assistance Program (LVAP). Hours must be credited to Disabled American Veterans.
- Scholarships can be used at any accredited institution of higher learning; to include universities, colleges, community colleges, vocational schools, etc.
- Scholarships must be utilized in full prior to the recipient attaining the age of 25, or within 6 years of receiving the scholarship, whichever is later.
- Nominations for this award may be submitted by the applicant, Voluntary Service Program Managers at VA medical centers, members of DAV departments and chapters, or friends and family.

- Pursue an engineering or related science degree through an ABET accredited program.
- Provide two (2) Letters of Recommendation - one (1) that focuses on academics and one (1) that speaks to your involvement in extra-curricular activities or employment
- Participation in a STEM-related extra-curricular activity /club or employment/shadowing that relates to your intended engineering major

ACS Scholars

Award: \$2,500 for freshman, \$3,000 for sophomores, \$5,000 for juniors and seniors.

- Be a U.S. citizen or a legal permanent U.S. resident
- Be African-American/Black, Hispanic/Latino, or American Indian (please see below for more details)
- Be a graduating high school senior or college freshman, sophomore or junior. Seniors can apply for their fifth year.
- Intend to major or already major in chemistry, biochemistry, chemical engineering, chemical technology, or another chemistry-related science AND plan to pursue a career in a chemistry-related science as well (please see below for more details)
- Be a full-time student at a high school or accredited college, university, or community college
- Demonstrate high academic achievement in chemistry or science (Grade Point Average 3.0 or higher)

AICPA/Robert Half Student Scholarship Award

Requirements:

- Pursuing an undergraduate or graduate-level degree in accounting or an accounting-related major. (Accounting-related shall be as determined by Sponsors in Sponsors' sole discretion.)
- Planning to pursue the CPA licensure but not presently be a CPA.
- Attending a public or private, not-for-profit (501(c)) four-year college or university in the U.S. or territories for the full 2022-23 academic year.
- Completed at least 30 semester hours (or equivalent) of college coursework, including at least 6 semester hours (or equivalent) in accounting, by end of spring 2022.
- Maintaining an overall and major GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

The program must be accepted by the state board of accountancy as meeting the educational requirements necessary for CPA licensure in the state you intend to become licensed OR in the state where your program is located.
- Willingness to remain engaged with the AICPA and to provide feedback for the development of this and other programs by the Association

California Association of Winegrape Growers Foundation Scholarship

- Have a parent or legal guardian who was employed by a California winegrape grower during the current or past growing season;

- Provide a letter of recommendation from an instructor, school principal or counselor that includes their signature and provides the address, telephone number and position held at the school;
- Submit a 500 word essay (approximately 2 pages, see application for details);

- All legal residents of the fifty (50) United States and the District of Columbia, as well as American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico. International students who have a student visa to attend school in the U.S. are considered legal residents and are therefore eligible

Shell Incentive Fund Scholarship for Undergraduate Students

Award: \$2,500

- Apply online. Applicants will be asked to upload a copy of their high school transcript and standardized test scores, and to provide the names & email addresses for two individuals to provide recommendations on the applicant's behalf.
- Plan to enroll full-time in one of the following majors (geology, geophysics, physics, chemical, civil, electrical, geological, geophysical, mechanical or petroleum engineering) at a specified institution (see list).
Be lawfully authorized to work on a full-time basis in the United States without any form of sponsorship.
- Incentive Fund Scholarship only: Be a member of an underrepresented minority group; Black (Not of Hispanic Origin), Hispanic/Latino, American Indian or Alaskan Native and must self-identify as such on the application

Allwork Scholarship

Award: up to \$7,500 each, with the potential of an Honor(s) grant of up to \$10,000

- Students seeking their first degree in architecture from an NAAB-accredited school in the State of New York are eligible.
- The dean or chair of the architectural school shall nominate up to two students from their respective college or university to apply.
- Nominated students will have a high level of academic performance and evidence of financial need.
- The financial need of each student shall be determined by the guidelines of the Financial Aid Officer of the school nominating the candidate.
- Students need not be U.S. citizens.

Award: 27 scholarships totaling US \$175,000; four (4) \$20,000 scholarships distributed over 4 years (\$5,000 per year, renewable); eight (8) \$10,000 scholarships distributed over 2 years (\$5,000 per year, renewable); 15 - \$1,000 one-time scholarships

- Demonstrate a passion for technology.
- Demonstrate leadership at school or in the community.
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or higher.

- Self-identify as a Chicana and/or Latina
- Be enrolled in an accredited college, university, or community college in one of the following California counties: Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, Sacramento, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano, San Francisco, Sonoma, or Yolo
- Have lived at least two (2) years in one of the above Northern California counties at the time of application
- Community College and Undergraduate students must:
- Be enrolled in a full-time college student (as defined by your institution) when applying and for the following academic year,

- Have completed 12 college units after high school graduation, and
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 college coursework
- Graduate students must:
- Be enrolled graduate/professional students completing course/thesis/dissertation; or have been accepted into graduate/profession school; and
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.7 for college course work
- Commit to attending the CLF Leadership Institute (August 5-7th, 2022 and February 2023)
- Commit to attending the CLF Annual Awards Dinner on January 2024
- Commit to volunteering 10 hours for CLF before March the year after being selected
- Past CLF awardees may not re-apply until four years after receiving our scholarship.

LULAC National Scholarship Fund

Requirements:

- Applicants must be a U.S. citizen, legal permanent resident, or be granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA).
Must have applied to or be enrolled as a full-time student in a college or university, including 2year colleges, or vocational schools that lead to an associate's degree. Graduate students must have applied to or be enrolled as a part-time student in a college or university.
- A student will not be eligible for a scholarship if he/she is related to a scholarship committee member, the Council President, or an individual contributor to the local funds of the Council
- Student applications must be mailed directly to a local participating LULAC Council in your area, the list of Councils will be available online by March 1, 2022. Applications will not be accepted at the LNEsc National Office.

National Federation of the Blind's Annual Scholarship

- Must be pursuing or planning to pursue a full-time, post-secondary course of study in a degree program at a U.S. institution in the fall of the year of application (one scholarship may be given to a person employed full-time while attending school part-time).
- Must participate in the entire NFB National Convention and in all of its scheduled scholarship program activities (finalists will receive assistance to attend the national convention).

- We provide need-based grants to students who are able to do academic work at the college level or are enrolled in a trade or technical program and are actively working for peace and

justice. Davis-Putter scholars are both graduate and undergraduate students and must be living in the U. S. and planning to enroll in an accredited school. Grantees must receive college credits for the time period covered by their grant. Early recipients fought for civil rights, against McCarthyism, and for peace in Vietnam. More recently, grantees have been active in the struggle against racism, sexism, homophobia, and other forms of oppression; building the movement for economic justice; and creating peace through international, anti-imperialist solidarity.

- Enrolling as or enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student at a U.S. accredited educational institution.
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale), emphasis on math or actuarial courses.
- Entering college freshmen must have a minimum ACT math score of 28 or SAT math score of 620.
- Intent on pursuing a career in the actuarial profession.

Carver Scholarship Program

Award: \$6,000 at public universities and \$8,000 at the private colleges

Requirements:

- Sophomore students currently enrolled in one of the three Regents' universities or one of the 22 participating four-year private institutions holding membership with the Iowa College Foundation
- Sophomore students currently attending a community college in Iowa, who intend to transfer to one of the participating four-year institutions as a junior in the fall semester of the award year.
- Must be a United States citizen and have graduated from an accredited high school in the state of Iowa or have been a resident of the state of Iowa for at least five consecutive years immediately prior to application.
- Students in all fields of study are eligible for an award.
- Students must present evidence of unusual barriers they have encountered, or are facing, in their pursuit of full-time college attendance.
- Students must demonstrate financial need on the basis of a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) filed prior to March 1st of the award year.

- Students must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale. Administrative officials at the participating institutions will be required to verify GPAs for accuracy based on the student's official academic transcript.

AFSA High School Essay Contest

Award: \$2,500

Requirements:

- Students whose parents are not in the Foreign Service are eligible to participate if they are in grades nine through twelve in any of the fifty states, the District of Columbia, the U.S. territories, or if they are U.S. citizens/lawful permanent residents attending high school overseas. Students may be attending a public, private, or parochial school. Entries from home-schooled students are also accepted. Previous first-place winners and immediate relatives of directors or staff of the AFSA, the U.S. Institute of Peace, Semester at Sea and National Student Leadership Conference are not eligible to participate. Previous honorable mention designees are eligible to enter.

Esperanza Education Fund

Award: \$5,000-\$20,000
